







Historical City • Takaoka is at the juncture of Hokuriku

A trip to Noto and Hida begins at Shin-Takaoka Station

Tourist Sights



National Treasure Zuirvu-Ji is the only national treasure in Toyama prefecture. A masterpiece of Edo Style Soto-Zen temple architecture which was commenced by Maeda Toshinaga circa 1603 and completed to its current style in 1663. Specific treasures include The Temple Gate (Somon), The Buddha Hall (Butsuden) and

Lecture Hall (Hatto). An easy 20 minute walk from JR Shin-Takaoka Station, North Gate, 5 minutes by car



The Manyo Historical Museum in Takaoka is a mecca for the study of Man'yoshu (Japanese Poetry - "The Collection of 10,000 Leaves"). There is a wealth of literary material on the trail of the "Birthplace of Man'yoshu" in Asuka, Nara and Takaoka, and on the collection itself.

Festivals & Events



The Mikurumayama Festival dates back to the founding of Takaoka City in 1609. Maeda Toshinaga gave a carriage to the people of the city who converted it to a float. The festival now has 7 floats that circulate through town The floats are hundreds of years old and have been designated national cultural assets

Held on 1st May each year



Takaoka Daibutsu is said to be one of the 3 most important large Buddha statues in Japan, following Nara and Kamakura. While the statue has been in existence for around 800 years, it was made from wood and has burnt down many times. Toyama, being famous for producing bronze, the Daibutsu was finally

completed in bronze in 1933. A 30 minute walk from JR Shin-Takaoka Station North Gate, 10 minutes by car



merchant trading area. It is located on the route of the annual Mikurumayama Festival and harks back to the town's founding in 1609. The street has been designated an important Traditional Building Group Preservation Area.

A 10 minute drive from JR Shin-Takaoka Station, or 25 minutes by bus on Katsukihara Route (from South Entrance Bus Stop)

Lattice" (1,000 frontages of latticed wood) and is the birthplace of the foundry industry in Takaoka. Traditional houses line the cobbled streets which are also decorated with bronze statues, making the town a photogenic delight.

A 10 minute drive from JR Shin-Takaoka station, or 30 minutes by bus on Katsukihara Route (from South Entrance Bus Stop)



during which all 4,516 poems contained in the 20 volumes are read in relay over three days and nights. From start to finish, the recital involves readings from over 2,000 people.

The first Friday, Saturday, and Sunday in

Manyo Festival events include a complete recitation of the Man'yoshu (Japanese Poetry), Takaoka Nabe Festival in Central Takaoka. Try many cheap dishes (nabes) cooked in the large pots made locally in Takaoka foundries. There are a multitude of flavours around the local venues, rich in local seafood, meat and vegetables. A truly delicious experience.

Gourmet Foods & Local Crafts



When Maeda Toshinaga founded Takaoka panese-style artisans were invited to establish businesses here, including those making traditional sweets. It was notably widespread from here-on-in that merchants welcomed their customers with these delicious



Takaoka Copperware
After the closure of Takaoka Castle in 1615 and to keep Takaoka as a thriving city, Maeda Toshinaga funded the development of the forgery manufacturing industry. Today, Takaoka still produces the highest share of forged iron, copper, tin and bronze in Japan, Metalware is noted as a traditional local craft



Takaoka Lacquerware Takaoka lacquerware is based on unique techniques such as "Chokokunuri" (carved and lacquered), "Yusukenuri" (lacquered and painted) and "Aogainuri" (inlaid Mother of Pearl and lacquer). Products such as trays and tea ceremony furnishings are still traditional crafts
